
He has taught remedial composition, ENGL 095 (Basic Writing I), and college-level composition, ENGL 102 (Composition II) at CSULA. He was originally recommended for a teaching position by one of our highly respected faculty members, who wrote of him: "I consider Dean Ramser ideally suited to teach composition courses in the English Department. I endorse him with wholehearted enthusiasm as a devoted and skilled teacher who would be a valuable asset." His teaching performance in the classroom has been very good, as observed and reported on by our Composition Coordinator and described by his students in quarterly CSULA Student Opinion Surveys.

Indeed, he has proven himself an excellent instructor, for having managed class enrollments of as high as 28 students and has taught four sections of composition within a single quarter. In a relatively short time, he has effectively met the teaching demands of our institution, which has one of the most diverse student populations around. I have spoken informally with some of his students, and they have openly praised his instruction. Because he has shown that he can teach effectively, I have asked him to teach a second year.

His syllabi and writing assignments are clearly written and well organized, demonstrating his practiced hand and expert knowledge in preparing materials for his students. With his amiable personality and teaching knowledge, one can readily discern that students would find him accessible and friendly.

His diligence and focused energy, his professional demeanor, and his apparent strength of character suggest that he would be as excellent a colleague at your institution as he has been at ours.
