This assignment is a chance to reflect on your writing this semester and make concrete goals that you would like to work towards after completing this class.

### Instructions:

After re-reading the class syllabus, reflect on which parts of the assignments you found the most challenging to you. Using basic essay format, you should introduce and explain at least three issues you know that you struggle with in your writing skills and describe how you responded to improving each of those areas throughout the course. These issues should be related to the completed course assignments and outcomes (for example, reflecting on how you struggle with writing poetry would not be appropriate for this assignment, as our course will not focus on poetry. On the other hand, writing about how you struggle with MLA format or organization of a research paper would be on topic, as our course will focus on both).

### Requirements

- Type using Microsoft Word (or a compatible program like Google Docs).
- Document should be formatted to 12 point, Times New Roman (or equivalent) font, double spaced, with 1" margins on all sides.
- A heading in the upper left corner should include your full name, the course number (including the two-digit code e.g. ENGL 1), the date, and the name of the assignment.
- Title of assignment centered on page.
- Clear, short paragraphs that are direct and to the point. Each paragraph should have a clear topic sentence.
- Use standard spelling, punctuation, capitalization, and grammar.
- If you have written a similar assignment for another class (such as WR 121), do not submit the same essay, as Turnitin will recognize the similarities. It is okay if you have some of the same goals, but you should be sure to write this assignment to specifically focus on our syllabus and plans for this class.
